MOTION FOR SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

Tab 2 Matthew Williams, PTA8695 (PCP – Bumgarner, Watson, Rust)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board which consisted of two counts. **COUNT I**: Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(b), Florida Statutes (2011) by committing fraud in the practice of physical therapy. **COUNT II**: Respondent violated Sections 486.125(1)(k) and 456.072(1)(a), Florida Statutes (2011) by making misleading, deceptive, or fraudulent representations in the practice of physical therapy.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Reprimand
- Appearance at the meeting which the Settlement Agreement is considered and the first meeting of Respondent's probationary period along with the proposed monitor
- Costs in the amount of \$1,645.00 to be paid within 5 years of the Final Order date with a minimum amount of \$329.00 due each year.
- \$10,000.00 fine to be paid within 5 years of the Final Order date, with a minimum amount of \$2000.00 due each year.
- Apply and register for the Florida Laws and Rules Exam within 90 days and obtain a passing score within 2 years of the Final Order date.
- Probation for a period of 2 years with indirect supervision by a Board approved monitor.
- Quarterly Respondent reports including:
 - Statement as to why the Respondent is on probation.
 - Description of practice location
 - Description of current practice
 - Statement of compliance
 - o Relationship with monitor
 - Advising the Board of any problems
 - Addressing compliance with any restrictions or requirements imposed by Board

Ms. Shah asked the board to consider requiring quarterly reports from the monitor in addition.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement with the clarification that the monitor shall submit quarterly reports as well. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

MOTION FOR DETERMINATION OF WAIVER AND ENTRY OF FINAL ORDER

Tab 3 Christopher Boyden, PT18769 (PCP – Hellman, Clendenin Kuhns)

Dr. Hellman was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was arrested for exposure of sexual organs in 2006 and charged with one count of exposure of sexual organs, in violation of Section 800.03, Florida Statutes to which he pled guilty in January 2007. Respondent was arrested for exposure of sexual organs in 2012 and charged with one count of exposure of sexual organs, in violation of Section 800.03, Florida Statutes, to which he was found guilty in October, 2012. As of November 5, 2012, Respondent had not notified the Board of Physical Therapy in writing he had entered a plea on January 7, 2007, or was found guilty on October 4, 2012.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to find respondent was properly notified of the Administrative Compliant and failed to timely respond thus, making a waiver of his rights to choose or elect the manner in which this case proceeds. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 2/0.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to find that the material facts, as alleged in the Administrative Complaint, are not in dispute, and to adopt the allegations of fact in the Administrative Complaint, as the Board's conclusions of fact in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 2/0.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to adopt the allegations of law in the Administrative Complaint, as the Board's conclusions of law in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 2/0.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to accept into the record and evidence the Department's investigative file inclusive of all documentation provided to the Board through their material as provided as for the purposes of determining penalties. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 2/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Reprimand
- Indefinite suspension until Respondent completes an evaluation with PRN and complies with their recommendations, if any. PRN must deem the Respondent safe to practice.

The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 2/0.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to assess the costs of \$281.53 to be paid within 180 days. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 2/0.

MOTION FOR VOLUNTARY RELINQUISHMENT

Tab 4 Jerry Aguiar, PTA39 (PCP – Waived)

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

Ms. Shah summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Sections 456.072(1)(q)(dd) and 486.125(1)(h)(k) Florida Statutes by violating a lawful order of the Board.

The case was presented as a Voluntary Relinquishment of licensure, in lieu of further disciplinary proceedings.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to accept the Voluntary Relinquishment. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

REQUEST FOR EARLY TERMINATION OF PROBATION

Tab 6 Suzanne McIntosh, PT5639

Respondent was present but not represented by legal counsel. Dr. Rivenbark, PRN, was also present to advocate on behalf of Ms. McIntosh. Both were sworn in by the court reporter.

Dr. Rivenbark addressed the Board advocating for early termination of Ms. McIntosh's probation. Dr. Rivenbark confirmed that the contract will remain in place until 2016 and any violations will result in a complaint to be filed with the Department of Health.

An Administrative Complaint (AC) was filed on August 20, 2010 against Ms. McIntosh for being unable to practice her profession of physical therapy with reasonable skill and

safety by reason of illness or use of alcohol, drugs, narcotics, chemicals or any other type of material or as a result of any mental or physical condition. On September 30, 2010 a Final Order was filed, accepting the terms of the Settlement Agreement below.

Ms. McIntosh and the Department entered into a Settlement Agreement which required:

- Letter of Concern
- Fine of \$1,500.00 to be paid within one (1) year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Costs in the amount of \$2,329.99 to be paid within one (1) year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Compliance with the terms of the monitoring contract with Professionals Resource Network.
- Appearances before the Board at such times as directed by the Board.
- Three (3) years probation from the date of the filing of a Final Order accepting and incorporating the Settlement Agreement. Respondent must follow the terms of probation outlined in the Settlement Agreement to include:
 - No home health care
 - Required supervision
 - Respondent may petition the Board for early termination of probation after a period of twelve (12) months.
- Respondent's supervisor must appear before the Board at the meeting at which the Settlement Agreement is heard or the first meeting following commencement of the probation.
- Registration of the Florida laws and rules exam within sixty (60) days
 of the filing of the Final Order. Successful completion of the Florida
 laws and rules exam to be completed within twelve (12) months of the
 filing of the Final Order.

Per the terms of her Settlement Agreement, Ms. McIntosh may petition the Board for early termination of probation after serving 12 month. The terms of the agreement require PRN to advocate for the removal of any practice restrictions during a Board meeting at which Ms. McIntosh is present and for the Board to determine that she is able to practice with reasonable skill and safety.

Ms. McIntosh requested the Board to terminate her probation early.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to approve the Request for Early Termination of Probation. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 2/0.

REQUEST FOR MODIFICATION OF FINAL ORDER

Tab 7 Fe Tan, PT7473

Respondent was not present nor represented by legal counsel.

An Administrative Complaint (AC) was filed on August 17, 2011 against Ms. Tan which consisted of two counts. **COUNT I**: Respondent violated Section 486.125(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2010) by entering a plea of guilty to a crime directly related to the practice of physical therapy. **COUNT II**: Respondent violated Sections 486.125(1)(k) and

456.072(1)(c), Florida Statutes (2010) by entering a plea of guilty to a crime directly related to the practice of physical therapy.

On September 19, 2011 a Final Order was filed, accepting the terms of the Settlement Agreement below.

- Reprimand
- Appearance
- Fine of \$5,000.00 to be paid within 365 days of the date of the Final Order
- Costs in the amount of \$920.00 to be paid within 365 days of the date of the Final Order
- Registration for the Florida laws and rules exam within 60 days and successful passage within 1 year of the date of the Final Order
- Probation for 2 years from of the date of the Final Order
- Indirect supervision by a Board approved monitor for the length of probation

Ms. Tan is currently in compliance with the Final Order. She is requesting a modification of the Final Order on the remaining balance of administrative fine due to financial hardships.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to approve the Request for Modification of Final Order, granting a 1 year extension from the modification Order date to pay the remaining balance of \$3,692.50. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 2/0.

PETITION FOR DECLARATORY STATEMENT

Tab 8 Jessica Smith, PTA10792

486.021(11), Florida Statutes

Ms. Smith was not present.

Ms. Smith has filed a petition for declaratory statement seeking clarification of the Florida Physical Therapy Practice Act in regards to staple removal by a Physical Therapist Assistant.

Ms. Clark recommended the board deny the petition as the petition does not meet statutory requirements by addressing the profession in general and not a licensee's specific set of circumstances.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Lohr made a motion to deny the Declaratory Statement as it does not comply with Chapter 120.565(2), Florida Statutes, and Chapter 28-105, Florida Administrative Code. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

PETITION FOR VARIANCE OR WAIVER OF RULE

Tab 9 Ernesto Hernandez De Armas, PT by Examination

Mr. Hernandez De Armas was not present.

Mr. Hernandez De Armas has filed a petition for waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C.

He is requesting a waiver from the education requirement(s) in regards to the deficiencies on his FCCPT evaluation in general and professional education. Based on his date of graduation, he is lacking 8.14 credits in general education and required course content.

Per prior board approval, FCCPT evaluated Mr. Hernandez De Armas' education on the documents submitted by him.

MOTION: Dr. Hellman made a motion to require Mr. Hernandez De Armas' personal appearance at the next board meeting to consider his application. The motion was seconded by and Dr. Petraglia carried 3/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to deny the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 3/0.

Tab 10 Erika Serrano, PT by Examination

Ms. Serrano was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Serrano has filed a petition for waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C.

She is requesting a waiver from the education requirement(s) in regards to the deficiencies on her ICD evaluation in general education. Based on her date of graduation, she is lacking 6 credits in general education including required course content.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to deny the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C.. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

Ms. Serrano withdrew her application.

Tab 11 Michael Siefman, PT by Endorsement

Mr. Seifman was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Mr. Siefman has filed a petition for waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C.

He is requesting a waiver from the education requirement(s) in regards to his degree and years of experience. He has provided a copy of his diploma from University of Health Sciences Antigua School of Allied Health Professions, West Indies confirming a Bachelor of Science in Physical Therapy obtained March 2, 1995.

He states his attempts to obtain official transcripts from his school have been unsuccessful as the program is closed. He has not provided credentialing for his foreign education. He has passed the NPTE and currently holds an active license in Indiana and Colorado.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Lohr made a motion to deny the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

Mr. Siefman withdrew his application.

Tab 12 Andrea Costa-Sheahan, PT by Endorsement

Ms. Costa-Sheahan was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Costa-Sheahan has filed a petition for waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003, F.A.C.

She is requesting a waiver from the education requirement(s) in regards to the deficiencies on her ICD evaluation in general and professional education. Based on her date of graduation, she is lacking 140 hours supervised internship and 21 credits in general education including required course content.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to grant the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.003, F.A.C. and approve Ms. Costa-Sheahan's application for licensure and to certify her to sit for the Florida Laws and Rules Exam. Upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

Tab 13 Diogo Trevisan, PT by Examination

Mr. Trevisan was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Mr. Trevisan has filed a petition for waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C.

He is requesting a waiver from the education requirement(s) in regards to the deficiencies on his FCCPT evaluation in general and professional education. Based on his date of graduation, he has met the credit hour requirement for professional education but is lacking 43 credits in general education including the required course content in both general and professional education.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Lohr made a motion to deny the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 3/0.

Mr. Trevisan withdrew his application.

Tab 14 Yibis Robles, PT by Examination

Ms. Robles was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Ms. Robles has filed a petition for waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001(3)(b)1g, F.A.C.

She is requesting a waiver from the education requirement in regards to her educational documents and credential evaluation. Ms. Robles states her college in Venezuela will not release educational documents to a third party and is often closed due to problems with the government and riots. Therefore she has been unsuccessful in completing a

credential evaluation as the Board rules require original documentation from the educational institution submitted directly to the credentialing agency.

Ms. Robles is in possession of her course syllabi and transcripts. She is requesting that the Board allow her to submit these documents directly to IERF in order to complete an evaluation.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Lohr made a motion to grant the Petition for Variance or Waiver of Rule 64B17-3.001(3)(b)1g. The motion was seconded by Dr. Petraglia and carried 3/0.

After discussion, the Board allowed Ms. Robles to waive her 90 day rights to be reviewed.

Tab 15 Ute Stern-Ratzel, PT by Endorsement

Ms. Stern-Ratzel was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Ms. Stern-Ratzel was represented by her attorney, Ms. Cynthia Mikos.

Ms. Stern-Ratzel was asked to appear to discuss her examination history. This tab was heard at the November 2012 Board meeting and continued to the February meeting at the request of Ms. Mikos.

MOTION: After discussion, Mr. Lohr made a motion to approve Ms. Schultz's application for licensure and to certify her to sit for the Florida Laws and Rules Exam and upon a passing score on the exam shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 2/1. Dr. Petraglia opposed.

REQUEST FOR CE HARDSHIP

Ms. Lesch was not present.

Ms. Lesch is requesting a hardship exemption from the 24 hour continuing education requirement for the 2013 licensure renewal. Due to the caregiver responsibilities for her husband, Ms. Lesch is unable to attend live courses. She is requesting either a waiver of the 12 hour live course requirement, or an allowance to complete all 24 hours of continuing education hours online.

Ms. Lesch holds a Clear/Active license since February 23, 2012 with no discipline.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to approve Ms. Lesch's hardship request by allowing her to complete all hours as home study. The motion was seconded by Mr. Lohr and carried 3/0.

Tab 22 Rachel Clark, Assistant Attorney General

Ms. Clark discussed the status of the Board's rules which are currently undergoing revisions. At the November 2012 Board meeting, the Board request Ms. Clark to present draft language regarding foreign trained applications by Endorsement.

64B17-3.003 Licensure by Endorsement.

- (1) An applicant filing DOH Form #DH-MQA 1142 Application for Licensure, Revised 02/10, which is available through www.doh.state.fl.us/mqa, and demonstrating that he or she meets the requirements of Rule 64B17-3.001, F.A.C., may be licensed to practice physical therapy by endorsement by presenting evidence satisfactory to the Board that the applicant has active licensure in another jurisdiction and has passed an examination before a similar, lawful, authorized examining board in physical therapy in such other jurisdiction if their standards for licensure are as high as those maintained in Florida. The standard for determining whether the standards of another jurisdiction are as high as the standards in Florida shall be whether the written examination taken for licensure in such other jurisdiction by applicants meeting Florida's minimum educational qualifications was through the national physical therapy examination provider certified by the Department.
- (2) An applicant who has been educated in a foreign country shall demonstrate minimum qualifications by providing the following:
 - a. A certified copy of the credential evaluation used by the physical therapy licensing board of another state. The evaluation must be on the appropriate coursework tool (CWT) adopted by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) and reflect the education criteria in place at the time of graduation; and;
 - b. Proof of 1000 clinical practice hours each year in the United States for five (5) out of the last ten (10) years:
 - 1. <u>Full-time teaching of physical therapy education may count toward 250 of the 1000 required practice hours per year.</u>

(3) An applicant who has failed to pass the National Physical Therapy Examination for Physical Therapists by or on the fifth attempt, regardless of the jurisdiction through which the examination was taken, is precluded from licensure.

The board verbally revised the word "shall" to "may" in subsection 2.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion to approve the proposed language for Rule 64B17-4.003 and directed Counsel to move forward with rule change procedures. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

MOTION: Mr. Lohr made a motion that the proposed rule amendment **WILL NOT** have an adverse impact on small business or will be likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity including government in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within 1 year after implementation of the rule. The motion was seconded by Dr. Hellman and carried 3/0.

64B17-4.003 Licensure by Endorsement.

- (1) An applicant, filing DOH Form #DH-MQA 1142 Application for Licensure, Revised 02/10, which is available through www.doh.state.fl.us/mqa, and demonstrating that he or she is licensed in another state may be licensed to practice as a physical therapist assistant by endorsement by presenting evidence of active licensure in another jurisdiction, under oath, and evidence satisfactory to the Board that the applicant from such other jurisdiction has been licensed under standards for licensure as high as those maintained in Florida. The standard for determining whether those requirements are as high as those in Florida shall be whether the applicant was required to meet educational standards equivalent to those set forth in subsection 64B17-4.001(3), F.A.C., and whether the written examination taken for licensure in such other jurisdiction was through the designated national physical therapist assistants examination provider certified by the Department.
- (2) An applicant who has been educated in a foreign country shall demonstrate minimum qualifications by providing the following:
 - a. A certified copy of the credential evaluation used by the physical therapy assistant licensing board of another state. The evaluation must be on the appropriate coursework tool (CWT) adopted by the Federation of State Boards of Physical Therapy (FSBPT) and reflect the education criteria in place at the time of graduation; and
 - b. <u>Proof of 1000 clinical practice hours each year in the United States for five (5)</u> out of the last ten (10) years;
 - 1. <u>Full-time teaching of physical therapy assistant education may count toward 250 of the 1000 required practice hours per year.</u>
