64B17-1.004 Probable Cause Panel.

(1) ~~The probable cause panel by majority vote shall determine whether probable cause exists to believe that a licensee has violated the provisions of Chapter 456 or 486, F.S., or the rules of the Department or Board. The determination as to whether probable cause exists regarding a violation of the provisions of Chapter 486 and 456, F.S., and/or the rules promulgated by the Board shall be made by majority vote of a probable cause panel of the Board.~~

(2) ~~Probable cause panel members shall be selected by tThe Board Chair, who shall also shall appoint at least two people to the probable cause panel and shall designate the panel Chair who is a current board member. Each panel shall be comprised of at least two (2) members. The appointed people shall be either current Board members or at least one current Board member and one or more former members of the Board. The panel must include a former or present consumer member if one is available, is willing to serve, and is appointed by the Board Chair, and must include at least one. Otherwise, the panel shall be composed of former or present Board members who are licensed physical therapists. The determination as to whether probable cause exists that a violation has occurred shall be made by a majority vote of the probable cause panel of the Board.~~

(3) ~~The Board Chair may designate an alternate panel with the same membership criteria to share the workload. With regard to either panel, tThe Board Chair may make temporary appointments, as needed, to conduct the business of a the panel in the absence or unavailability of a regularly appointed panel member.~~

(4) If a Board member has reviewed a case as a member of the probable cause panel, that member shall be on the panel for reconsideration of that case if reconsideration is requested by the prosecutor and that panel member is able and available.

MOTION: After discussion Dr. Tasso voted to accept the language as amended. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 4/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to find the proposed revisions will not be likely to directly or indirectly increase regulatory costs to any entity (including government) in excess of \$200,000 in the aggregate in Florida within 1 year after the implementation of the rule. The Motion was seconded by Mr. Chenoweth and carried 5/0.

5. Ratification List for Approved Applicants

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to ratify the list of physical therapists for licensure by examination/endorsement (Exhibit A), 198 in number starting with PT 31132 and ending with PT 31586. Upon successful completion of the National Physical Therapy Exam and/or the Florida Laws and Rules Exam, shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 4/0.

- Physical Therapist Assistant Applicants

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to ratify the list of physical therapists assistants for licensure by examination/endorsement (Exhibit B), 93 in number starting with PTA 26609 and ending with PTA 26726. Upon successful completion of the National Physical Therapy Exam and/or the Florida Laws and Rules Exam, shall be licensed. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 4/0.

6. Ratification List for Employment Exemption.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to ratify the list of physical therapists/assistants who administratively approved exemptions, 3 in number beginning with Owen Dunkley and ending with Jacob Wood. The motion was seconded by Mr. Chenoweth and carried 4/0.

NEW BUISNESS

7. Anti-Trust

Dr. Tasso made an additional inquiry regarding anti-trust and requested a discussion at the meeting. Ms. Norr provided a brief description and addressed any questions.

Staff has been informed that the Department of Legal Affairs has verbally indicated a willingness to amend the Medical Quality Assurance contract to add representation for a legal defense for an anti-trust suit. However, this is for legal defense not liability coverage.

Due to the possibility of Federal statutory language change, this will be placed on the October agenda for further discussion.

8. Discussion of Potential Statutory Change Related to Oath Requirements.

During the May 6, 2016 meeting, Board Counsel Lynette Norr noted an objection from the Joint Administrative Procedures Committee (JAPC) regarding the applicant statement found in the licensure application. JAPC indicated that s.

486.041, 486.103, and 486.107, F.S., require an "oath" from applicants whereas s. 486.081, does not. In May, the Board approved language in an attempt to address JAPC concerns. Subsequently, Ms. Norr informed JAPC that the Board would move forward with the rule revisions but would consider potential statutory changes to address inconsistencies in the law regarding the oath requirement.

This was placed on the agenda for discussion of a possible statutory change.

Provided for review was draft language that removes oath requirement, s. 92.50, F.S., and the applicant statement language approved in May.

MOTION: After discussion Dr. Tasso made a motion to approve the provided statutory language and advised Mr. Hall to submit the language to the Department for a proposed statutory change. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 4/0.

At this time, although this was not a regularly scheduled agenda item, the Board allowed Mr. Eduardo Rodriguez, PTA Program Director from Professional Hands Institute to address the Board. Mr. Rodriguez indicated he was present on behalf of the students from Professional Hands Institute as they were unable to attend the meeting. He inquired with the Board what guidance they could provide to the students who were affected by House Bill 941 regarding the statutory change in requiring a CAPTE education.

Dr. Petraglia expressed that the Board sympathizes with the student's situation. She indicated the Board has done their due diligence with students who were complete before the July 1st deadline, however it is the Board's duty to follow the statutes that are in place.

Dr. Tasso made the recommendation that the students could complete a teach-out program that holds the required CAPTE accreditation.

Dr. Pabian expressed the challenges the students could face transitioning into a CAPTE program due to the standard of low pass rates. He indicated a school can be placed on probation due to low pass rates of the National Physical Therapy Exam. Dr. Pabian also stated his concerns regarding the length of curriculum indicated on the Professional Hands Institute transcript, as some courses indicated to be complete within eleven days.

This will be placed on the October agenda for further discussion.

PETITION FOR RECONSIDERATION OF EXEMPTION FROM EMPLOYMENT

7. Esther Curvelo, PT 9931

Ms. Curvelo was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Certified interpreter, Darianny Hernandez was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

On May 6, 2016 Ms. Curvelo came before the board for a request for exemption from disqualification from employment. After discussion her request was denied due to it not being more than three years after Ms. Curvelo has been released from confinement, supervision or other nonmonetary condition imposed by the court for a disqualifying felony as set forth in 435.07(1)(a)(1), Florida Statutes.

Ms. Curvelo submitted a request for a reconsideration of an Exemption from Disqualification from Employment.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Petraglia made a motion to deny the Request for Reconsideration due to failure to submit clear and convincing evidence of rehabilitation. The motion was seconded by Dr. Tasso and carried 4/0.

DISCIPLINARY PROCEEDINGS

MOTION FOR HEARING NOT INVOLVING DISPUTED ISSUES OF MATERIAL FACT

- 1. Shane Richard Miller, PTA 11468
(Case No. 2015-30412)
(PCP-Chenoweth, Candela, Bumgarner)**

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter.

Mr. Chenoweth was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Gilani summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 486.125 (1) (h) respondent failed to meet the requirements in case number 2013-17611 filed on March, 5, 2015. Specifically, respondent failed to provide proof of completion of the Laws and Rules Examination within 6 months of the Final Order.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to find that the Respondent was properly served and has requested an informal hearing. The motion was seconded by Dr. Tasso and carried 3/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to adopt the materials under Tab 1 and any addendum materials into evidence in this proceeding. The motion was seconded by Dr. Tasso and carried 3/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to adopt the findings of fact as set forth in the Administrative Complaint. The motion was seconded by Dr. Tasso and carried 3/0.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to adopt the conclusions of law as set forth in the Administrative Complaint and find that this constitutes a violation of the Chapters 486 and 456, Florida Statutes. The motion was seconded by Dr. Tasso and carried 3/0.

MOTION: After discussion, Dr. Tasso made a motion to impose the following penalties:

- Completion of the unfulfilled Florida laws and rules exam within 30 days of the filing of the Final Order.
- \$1,000 fine to be paid in 1 year of the filing of the Final Order.
- Completion of an ethics or professionalism course through the American Physical Therapy Association (APTA) or the Federation of State Boards of

Physical Therapy (FSBPT) within 6 months of the filing of the Final Order. The course must be submitted to the Board for approval.

MOTION: Dr. Petraglia made a motion to assess and accept costs of \$49.18. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 3/0.

MOTION FOR SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT

2. Kathleen Galica a/k/a Kathleen Divine, PT 3638 (Case No. 2014-17499) (PCP-Chenoweth, Candela, Bumgarner)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Ms. Galica was represented by Stephen Brownlee, Esq.

Mr. Chenoweth was recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Gilani summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 486.125(1)(a); unable to practice with reasonable skill and safety. PRN received multiple complaints about the respondent practicing physical therapy while smelling of alcohol, Department approved evaluators have found the Respondent unsafe to practice without treatment due to Alcohol Dependence, and most recently, Respondent was convicted of a DUI in January 2016.

Martha Brown from PRN was present and sworn in by the court reporter. She informed the Board of the process of Ms. Galica entering into a PRN contract.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Reimbursement of Costs \$5,546.15 to be paid within 5 years of the filing of the Final Order.
- Indefinite Suspension from practice until respondent can demonstrate to the Board that she is safe to practice with skill and safety.

MOTION: Dr. Tasso made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 3/0.

3. Pinky Gallardo Aquino, PT 30303 (Case No. 2015-19758) (PCP- Chenoweth, Candela, Bumgarner)

Respondent was present and sworn in by the court reporter. Ms. Aquino was represented Jonathan Rose, Esq.

Mr. Chenoweth recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Gilani summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 456.072(1)(w) Florida Statutes (2014) and 486.126 (1)(k) Florida Statutes (2014), Respondent failed to comply with the requirements for profiling and

credentialing by making sure untrue representations on her initial application for licensure. Respondent failed to disclose disciplinary action taken against her physical therapy license in Illinois. The underlying circumstances were that the Respondent had participated in an exam preparatory class that is unlawfully utilized live test questions. Her Illinois license was only reprimanded and she was admonished to conform her conduct to the requirements of the Illinois Physical Therapy Act.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Letter of Concern
- Fine of \$1,000 to be paid within 180 days of the filing of the Final Order.
- Reimbursement of Costs \$526.98 to be paid within 180 days of the filing of the Final Order.

MOTION: Dr. Tasso made a motion to accept the Settlement Agreement. The motion was seconded by Dr. Pabian and carried 3/0.

**4. Tiffany Vann PT 29108
(Case No. 2015-00371)
(PCP- Chenoweth, Parker, Stoff)**

Respondent was not present nor represented by counsel.

Mr. Chenoweth recused due to participation in the Probable Cause Panel.

Ms. Gilani summarized the case for the Board. Respondent was charged with the following violation: Section 486.125(1)(g) Florida Statutes (2014), Respondent had her license to practice physical therapy acted against by the licensing authority of another State. The Iowa Board disciplined Respondent's license for failing to maintain sufficient, timely, and accurate documentation in patient's records and failing to store records in accordance with state and federal statutes and employer policy. Respondent's Iowa license was cited and warned and Respondent was required to pay \$1,000 civil penalty, which she has paid in full.

The case was presented as a Settlement Agreement that would impose the following:

- Letter of Concern
- Fine of \$500.00 to be paid within 90 days of the filing of the Final Order.
- Reimbursement of Costs \$438.04 to be paid within 90 days of the filing of the Final Order.
